May 29, 1928 - February 19, 2021

Edith G. Middleton acquired her heavenly wings on February 19, 2021 at the FutureCare of Canton facility after her brief battle with COVID.

She was one of eight children born to Ruby Winstead Paylor and Mose Paylor of Roxboro, N.C. on May 29, 1928. She was educated in the Person Country Public School system. She migrated from Roxboro, N.C. to Baltimore City where she later met and married Julius Middleton (bka Milton) on December 26, 1957.

Her employment consisted of being a sterilizing technician at Johns Hopkins Hospital, being a short-order cook at the drug store across from Johns Hopkins for a number of years before venturing into cosmetology school and obtaining her board certification. She worked as hairdresser for a while in a beauty shop before starting a family business where she and Milton (board certified barber) would enjoy and that consisted of a convenient store with a barber shop in the rear on Tivoly St. off of 29th Street in Baltimore. She had a special calling for gifted and special needs children so she trained and was certified to work in the school system for over 10 years until she retired at age of 67. She continued to do hair at home until her legs and hands weakened.

Edith was devoted to her family-while Milton was working-she made sure we enjoyed our extra curriculum activities in sports and she enjoyed gathering us

together to go fishing, drive-in movies nights and just playing in the park. She instilled in us the need to work for what we got and not be lazy and that you can do whatever you put your mind to do. She was our encourager and motivator and helper when needed. She loved her sisters and brothers and would look forward to gatherings at family reunions in Roxboro or just here in Baltimore which most of the time would end up on a fishing bank. During the later years she and Milton still worked together as she served as his dispatcher for his taxi service (hacking service).
