Edna completed her formal education in the Baltimore City School System at Carver Vocational Technical High School with a concentration in “dress-making.” She was later employed by London Fog and other similar companies where she continued to perfect her talent as a seamstress. She had many friends during her employment that lasted many years after her retirement. Edna’s only child, Leon N. Thompson, Sr. predeceased her.

Edna accepted Christ at an early age. She later became a member of Sharon Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Dr. James L. Moore. Edna loved her church and remained a faithful and devoted member of Sharon Baptist for more than sixty-five years, serving as a member of the J. L. Edna was truly a precious jewel. She loved her family unconditionally. She loved life and lived it to the fullest, but most of all, she loved her God. In her past-time, she loved cooking and sewing. She would shop for the best material to make her own clothing. She was also a great cook and was always collecting recipes for the next meal. She loved reading and keeping up with the latest news. Her favorite TV time was spent watching the Food Channel. She will be remembered by all her friends for her kindness, encouragement and support, always giving of her time to help others.
