The second oldest of five, Nard was the older brother everyone wanted to have. From teaching his siblings lifelong lessons to pulling many pranks, Nard left a lifetime of memories. Nard loved cars, music, and fashion. He knew so much about cars you would have thought he was a mechanic by trade. Nard could fix anything on a car and was passionate about his car looking nice. From ensuring it was washed weekly to having the best spinners around, Nard was a car enthusiast. His siblings recall not being able to eat, drink or rough house in his car!

Nard’s attention to detail was seen in many aspects of his life. He was meticulous about ensuring his clothes and shoes were kept in the best

condition. He enjoyed cleaning, cooking, and looking his very best. Although cleaning became of utmost importance, it did not start that way. As a child, Nard did not like to clean. He would skip out on cleaning days and leave the work to be completed by his siblings. One day, Nard left home to escape cleaning and went to his Grandmother's house. His Aunt Darlene called his mother Betty Ann to see what she had done to Nard because he was upset. Betty had to inform Darlene that Nard skipped out on cleaning and she did not do anything to him— but she would when he got back home.

Although Nard was very skinny, he did not miss a meal. Cooking is engrained in the Johnson family and Nard loved his Grandmother's food. His favorites were pepper steak and rice and spaghetti. In one of his last conversations with his mom, he was so excited about coming home and eating some good homecooked meals— especially that pepper steak and rice.

Nard enjoyed traveling and attending car shows. He had an unforgettable time in the Bahamas and made memories in a few states.

Nard's life changed for the better when his daughter, A'miyah was born on April 4, 2006. He was an excellent father and did his best to provide her with everything she needed and wanted. Distance and time did not keep him from fulfilling his duties as a father. He loved his daughter with every part of his heart.

Nard was a friendly, inviting and personable young man. He was giving and wanted to help others. In fact, he convinced his parents to allow one of his friends to move into the house during his high school years. Nard was calm, cool and collected. He got along with anyone. His calming and welcoming demeanor allowed him to have loyal friends who always supported him. His encouraging spirit allowed him to be a mentor to other young, incarcerated men. He taught them the importance of getting out of the system and doing

their best when they were released. Nard will always be remembered for his good heart and beautiful spirit.

Family was important to Nard. He spoke with parents weekly, wrote letters, and enjoyed many visits from family and friends. In his last conversation with his father, Nard was his usual playful self. He often joked asked his dad “drove the big truck for nothing” regarding his father’s job as a trucker. Nard asked, “Are you just driving the big truck for nothing”? Eddie responded, “Yeah” and then they laughed and expressed their love for one another. Nard will be greatly missed by those who loved and admired him.
