He had a special knack for putting colors and designs together to produce a beautiful decorative piece that he would display in his home or give as a gift. Sonny was a lover of music, with a special liking for jazz, and he passed on that appreciation of jazz to his children and other family members. Holiday time for the James family was a special time for the whole family. When Sonny and Dolly's children were young, Christmas was an especially fun time for him. Sonny liked to stay up all night on Christmas Eve to decorate the house and the Christmas tree. He wouldn't allow the children

to help because he wanted to surprise them with his handiwork. Sonny invited his Sisters and Brothers to the house to stay up all night with him while he did his decorating magic. Over the years his children have said that they can still remember the laughter that was coming from the living room on Christmas Eve while Dolly, Sonny and his Brothers and Sisters had fun together. Over the years Sonny worked as a skilled laborer at Sparrows Point, as a print operator at a printing company, and various other jobs. Sonny retired in 1990.
