April 21, 1923 - March 2, 2002

Edward Dixon, son of the late Edward W. Dixon Sr. and DeCora Simms Dixon, was born on April 21, 1923 in Baltimore, Maryland. He went home to be with the Lord on March 2, 2002 after a lengthy illness at Harborside-Harford Gardens Nursing Home. "Suitcase," as he was affectionately known, received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System. He graduated from Dunbar Senior High School in 1943. After graduating, he joined the United States Army Corps. Edward retired as a Sergeant with an honorable discharge in 1946. He received a Good Conduct Medal, Asiatic Pacific Theater Service Ribbon with Bronze Arrowhead, and World War II Victory Ribbon. After leaving the military, Edward began employment with the National Security Agency. He retired from federal service on November 2, 1990 after receiving numerous citations include having thirty-five years of perfect attendance. On March 10, 1950, Edward was baptized at Wayland Baptist Church under spiritual leadership of Rev. William Payne. "Suitcase" was a very humorous man: he always had a joke to tell. He was a music lover; he would sit at his piano or organ pounding out tunes, singing and humming. He was an avid reader. Antique shopping was his passion. He loved walking. Edward made friends wherever he went. He had a very kind heart. If you needed one dollar, her would give you five. If you were hungry or needed a place to stay, his home was open. "Knuckel Head," Money don't grow on trees, "these darn people," "Shicks me nibbles" and "Who let the dog out", were a few funny saying of his. Whatever was needed or you were out of, he

would open the trunk of his car and he would have it. He will be missed and remembered by everyone. His wife, Pricilla; two sisters, Mrs. Roszena Lee and Mrs. Addie Kelly; and one granddaughter, Pricilla, preceded him in death. Edward Dixon leaves to cherish his memory: four daughters, Hattie, Trecie, Lorraine and Christina; five sons, William Dennis, Steve, Michael and Donald; fourteen grandchildren, eighteen great-grandchildren, two great-great-grandchildren; two brothers, Clarence Dixon and Meyer Dixon; one sister-in-law, Mrs. Leona Spriggs; three sons-in-law, numerous nephews, nieces, cousins, other family and friends.
