



## Edward Eugene Simpson

April 3, 1943 - August 30, 2003

Major Edward Eugene Simpson Jr., was the son of the late Edward Eugene Simpson Sr. and Ella Louise Simpson. He was born in Baltimore on April 3, 1943. He was called home to be with the Lord on Saturday, August 30, after a short illness. Major Simpson attended City College High School. He entered the Army in 1959, and subsequently earned his high school equivalency and a bachelor's degree in business from Hampton Institute, graduating in 1973. A decorated Vietnam veteran, Major Simpson was the recipient of a Bronze Star for "meritorious achievement in ground operations against hostile forces." He also received the Silver Service Star, two Good Conduct medals, Army Commendations, Vietnam Service and Vietnam Campaign medals, and the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry. He served in Korea in 1976, and retired with the rank of Major in 1979. A New Jersey resident during Prudential management training, he later moved to Cockeysville and managed Prudential's Timonium branch. He moved to Pikesville and married Brenda in 1983. Retiring from full-time work in Prudential's Baltimore-area operations in 1998, he continued working part-time as a financial planner until the time of his death. A member of the Flying Eagles motorcycle club, Major Simpson rode a Honda Gold Wing. He also enjoyed hiking, camping, and repairing computers. Major Simpson is survived by his wife of 20 years, Brenda; four sons, Edward Eugene Simpson III of Columbia, Ulric Christopher Copeland of Baltimore, Eugene Edward Simpson (Mighty), and Jonathan Simpson, both of Orange, NJ; a daughter, Eigna Simpson Dark, of Upper Marlboro; two daughters-in-

law, Nona Copeland of Baltimore, and Elisa Simpson of Columbia; a son-in-law, Charles Dark of Upper Marlboro; two brothers, Arthur Simpson, and Lorenzo Simpson; a sister, Ella Simpson Day; all of Baltimore; a brother-in-law, Herman Day; and sister-in-law, Margo Simpson, both of Baltimore. Four grandchildren also survive him: Tazz Thomas, Gianni Simpson, Bryanna Simpson, and Julius Simpson, and a host of nieces, nephews and other relatives. A daughter, Joella Simpson, preceded him in death.
