



Pastor Edward E Jackson

February 20, 1944 - May 26, 2016

Edward E. Jackson, beloved son of the late William G. and Nellie B. Jackson, was born on Sunday, February 20, 1944 in Kankakee, Illinois and departed this life on May 26, 2016 in the care of his family at the age of 72 years. The fourth born of eleven children, he graduated from Kankakee Senior High School in June 1961.

He joined the Marine Corps on October 3, 1961 and served in California, Hawaii, Japan, Okinawa, the Philippines and Vietnam. He was wounded August 13, 1966 and spent a year in Great Lake Naval Hospital in Great Lakes, Illinois. For this he was given a Purple Heart. He was retired on disability on June 7, 1972.

After he retired from the military service he went to work for Uniroyal and the federal government in Joliet, Illinois.

In December 1970, he and his brother Barry moved to the Washington, DC area to start new lives.

On December 7, 1970 he went to work at C&P Telephone Company and worked for them for thirty years and six months. He retired on June 28, 2001. He joined Mt. Nebo A.M.E. Church in 1982 and Ebenezer A.M.E. Church in 1984, under the pastorate of Grainger Browning, II. He was called into

ministry in 1985 and served under various ministries in Washington, DC and Maryland. He left and volunteered to start a new church under Pastor Tony Smith. He was sent to help a church in Federalsburg, Maryland and eventually was set in place by Pastor Tony Smith to take over Agape Love Ministries International. He changed the name of the church to Vision of Glory Christian Center at the direction of Pastor Tony Smith.

Eddie or "Butch", as he was called by family, attended Howard University, then Divinity School and the University of Maryland University College.

Edward was preceded in death by his mother, father, brothers - Richard Earl, Willie Harwell, Barry Alan, David Ray, Dennis Jay; sister - Melba. He is survived by his brother - Jerry Paul (Audrey); sisters - Christopher David and daughter - Annita Butler of Kankakee, Illinois; three aunts- Virginia Darnell, Osie Stubbins and Vietta Coffie; one uncle - Robert Harwell Jr; several nieces and nephews and a host of relatives and friends.

He also leaves behind his second close knit family that includes: Pastor Tony Smith, Pastor Marcus Bevans & family, Pastor Lamont Williams & family, Minister Donta Thomas & family, Deacon Chris and Evangelist Tarsia Gray and family, and all the kids in Victorious Ministries.
