



Edward Livingston

November 18, 1932 - November 1, 2022

On November 1, 2022, MR. EDWARD (BRO) LIVINGSTON passed away at the Gilchrist Center. He was 89 years old. He was born on November 18, 1932 in Baltimore, Maryland. His parents were the late Vonzella and Jefferson Livingston.

Mr. Livingston attended Paul Lawrence Dunbar High School. He dropped out at the age of 18 to enlist in the U.S. Navy where he served for 4 years.

In 1951, Edward married his high school sweetheart, Shirley Mae Holmes. They had two daughters, Vernell (who preceded him in death) and Mozetta. Years later, he married Romaine Reed. Initially, he was employed as a janitor with the Baltimore City School System. Later, he obtained a GED certificate. Then, Mr. Livingston got an AA degree from the Community College of Baltimore. He earned a BA degree from Antioch University and was employed as an income maintenance specialist until his retirement.

Mr. Livingston was a determined community activist. He was a fixture at community meetings.

As a hobby, he took up photography. He loved to take pictures at family and community gatherings.

He took pictures of jazz artists and gospel groups like the Chaney sisters. His generosity was legendary. He loved spending time with his grandson.

Edward is survived by Virginia Boone, a loyal companion; a daughter, Mozetta R. Trueheart and her husband, Wilson N. Trueheart Jr., a grandson, Wilson N. Trueheart III; brother, Harry Livingston; uncle, Wade Livingston and his wife Ethel; and his best friend, Wanda Parker. He also leaves a host of nieces and nephews and a long-time friend, Clifton Church. Photographer Bob Houston, who taught him how to make pictures, preceded him in death.
