Here he worked with institutionalized, emotionally and socially challenged children, youth and young adults. He developed extraordinary rehabilitation programs that won him acclaim in his field. He was a very creative and sensitive man and enjoyed writing and often wrote poetry and prose. He tried his hand at playing a trumpet, but many encouraged him to keep his day job. Butch, as his family knew him, Jabo as he was known to some friends, and Ed to many others, was a man with as many talents as he had names. He was married to Emily Sisco in February 1974. From this union were born two children, a son, Jaleel, and a daughter, Yasmeen. Butch deeply loved his family and adored his children. His robust and energetic personality was like a magnet to most that met him. He was friendly and out going and loved to help people. Butch received the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal Savior shortly after becoming a resident of Baltimore several years ago. He leaves to mourn, his father, Edward M.
