Edward Samuel Johnson, Sr. (Eddie), only child of the late Edward and Blanche Johnson was born on July 13, 1921 in Baltimore, MD. He departed this earthly life on Thursday, July 8, 2004. Eddie received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System. At an early age, he accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior and was baptized at People' Christian Church, which later became Memorial Baptist Church, under the late Reverend C.E. Brown. Eddie was a member of the United States Coast Guard from 1943-1946 and served his country during World War II. Eddie was employed in the field of law enforcement in the Baltimore City Police Department. Eddie's love of people was reflected in his daily life. He never could sit still even through the times of illness. The illness would not get the best of him. As soon as he was well enough, off he went. He spoke frequently about his "Good Lord" and "The Man Upstairs." He was liked by all who knew him and un-liked by some because he spoke the truth. Eddie loved his church and as a member of the Sanctuary Choir, he praised God with his profound bass voice. His bass voice took him many places with the choir, including the memorable yearly commitment of singing spirituals and carols to patients at The Johns Hopkins Hospital on Christmas Eve for the past 40 years. Eddie was a willing worker, and very proud of cleaning, waxing and buffing "his floors." Nobody could make them shine like he could. Eddie leaves to cherish his memory: three children, a son, Edward S. Johnson, Jr., two daughters, Michelle Douglas and Patrice Johnson; five grandchildren, Dawn, Nia,

Gabrielle, Nicole, Danielle; two great grandchildren, Jalen and Maraiyah; former spouses, Anna Johnson and Christine Doss Johnson (deceased); cousins Charles and Itelia Thompson; devoted friends Jean Carlisle and Ellen Reed; and a host of family and friends.
