July 4, 1931 - November 22, 2002

Elbert Jacobs, Sr.'s earthly journey ended Friday afternoon on November 22, 2002. Son of the late Eartie and Percy Jacobs, he was born on July 4, 1931, in Halifax County, North Carolina. He moved to Baltimore, Maryland at a young age. Entering the United States Army at the age of eighteen, he served his country until 1953. Upon his release Jake, as he was called, met and married his loving wife, Annie Romance Tucker. In 1959, he became the first black man to pasteurize milk in Baltimore City. This event at the Cloverland Dairy made the news. He retired from Cloverland Dairy after over thirty years of dedicated service. He was a hard working, giving, loving husband, father and grandfather. If you were fortunate enough to know "Jake," you were blessed. He was a friend, indeed. Two sons preceded him in death, Elbert Jacobs, Jr. and Terry Faulkner. Jake loved people and was always doing something to help his fellow man, neighbors, family, friends and strangers alike. He loved to cook and did it well. He took great pride in preparing his wife's birthday dinners, cakes that were fit for a Queen. He loved his quiet time and loved to fish.
