Elease Carolyn Gerald Maybank, 60, may have lost the battle, but she definitely won the war. She peacefully passed away at Gilchrist Center for Hospice Care in Baltimore on Tuesday, November 13, 2006, after a long struggle with a host of illnesses. She made friends wherever she went and left a lasting impression with them. The nurses who cared for her often referred to her as the Queen. Anyone who met her for the first time never knew how sick she really was because she was a champion with a lively spirit and a beautiful smile. Many have described her as "selfless and sweet, yet fiesty" symbolic of her zodiac sign, Taurus the Bull. Elease would always preach to her family that nothing beats a try, but a zero and a quitter never wins and winner never quits. But the one saying she repeated often was, you are born to live and you live to die, but what you do in between is what really matters. For Elease, what mattered most was her family and friends. She was always available and accessible to lend a helping hand as a loyal sister, dedicated wife, loving mother, supportive grandmother and compassionate friend. She commanded and accepted nothing less than the best and challenged others to also strive for excellence. She never gave in or gave up. Elease is best remembered for her witty sense of humor, strong work ethic, insightful conversations, passion for baking and cooking, unconditional love and undying Christian faith. So many people told her she should write a book and share all of her knowledge. And, if you tasted her pineapple upside down cake or pound cake, then you can attest to her culinary expertise. Elease also enjoyed reading novels and

mysteries, solving crossword puzzles, playing the game of Scrabble and planning family vacations. Her favorite color is burgundy. She was baptized at age 12 at Whitestone Baptist Church in Baltimore. She often recalled that day as the day she began walking with God when she saw the Lord at the front of the church with his hand reaching out to her. Born May 6, 1946, in Baltimore, to Phillip A. Gerald, Sr., and Mary Elizabeth Shannon, Elise was the eldest of her ten siblings. She was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System and graduated from Edmondson High School in 1964 and went on to attend college at the now Morgan State University. In 1973, she married her husband Ronnie Maybank on April 21. From their union came two children Anton Talishman and Ronnell Maria. Though she digressed from her desire to become a schoolteacher, she still began her career in the school system as a secretary. Talented and skilled, Elise tried her hand at a few different positions before settling in on a 22-year career with the telephone company, now Verizon. She retired from the operations department in Hunt Valley on May 7, 2001. Elise is survived by a legacy of love - husband: Ronnie Maybank; children: Anton (Libbie) Maybank and Ronnell (James) Sampson; godchild: Genee' (Wayne) Green, grandchildren: Adriel C.
