On June 17, 1938, ELEVIA FRANCES TURNER was born to the late Charles Sims and Helen F. Kelly in Howard County, Maryland. Elevia was educated in the Howard County Public School System. She graduated from Harriet Tubman High School in Elkridge, Maryland. She later continued her education at Baltimore City Community College and received her Associate's degree in sociology. Elevia accepted Christ at an early age as her personal Savior. In her early Christian walk, Elevia attended St. Stephens A.M.E. Church. She later became a member of Mount Olive Freewill Baptist Church in Baltimore City. A Time to Live Elevia's precious nickname was Levie. She met, fell in love, and married Albert Pete Turner Sr. (who departed ahead to prepare a place with the Lord).
