Elijah Loftin was born on August 15, 1912 to the late Calvin and Minnie Loftin. He departed this life peacefully during the early morning, October 3, 2005. He was raised and attended the public Schools in Kinston, North Carolina. In 1934, Elijah was united in holy matrimony to Mary Jane King, who preceded him in death on July 7, 1985. The young couple moved to Baltimore, Maryland on July 4, 1943. In 1945, they adopted an infant son and named him, Timothy. Elijah Loftin worked as a construction worker for over thirty-five years. He retired as a cement finisher from the Kirby Construction Company in Baltimore. Shortly after arriving in Baltimore, Elijah Loftin joined the Knox Presbyterian Church under the pastorate of the late H. Octavious Graham. He served faithfully as an usher and a deacon until his health began to fail. He later joined the Apostolic Faith Church under the pastorate of Bishop Monroe Saunders. Mr. Loftin's greatest joy was when he was able to worship with his son at the Pleasant Rock Baptist Church. Elijah Loftin was a spiritual man who loved the Lord. He praised the Lord at all times even in the hospital and in the rehabilitation center. He shared his testimony with his family, friends, and caregivers. He was a kind man who always spoke words of wisdom, understanding, and encouragement to those around him. Elijah Loftin leaves to cherish his memory: his son, Dr. Timothy Loftin; his daughter-in-law, Dr. Doris Loftin; three granddaughters, Letricia Loftin Baker, Staci Loftin Allen, and Timera Loftin; three great granddaughters; Brianna, Brooklyne, and Braxton Baker; niece, Pauline Hart; a devoted caregiver, Valerie Murray; and a host of

nieces, nephews, cousins relatives and friends.
