January 25, 1918 - September 8, 2002

Elizabeth Augusta Covington Allen, the first child of the late Earl and Mamie Covington, was born in Anson county, North Carolina on January 25, 1918. Education for Elizabeth began in Anson County, and continued in Baltimore, Maryland at the Saint Paul Institute of Nursing, where she was trained as a Practical Nurse. Sixty-four years ago on August 27, 1938, Elizabeth became the wife of Fred Jackson Allen. This union was blessed with five children: Earl, Audrey, Fred Jr., Donald and Denise. Brothers, T.J., Hayward and Nathan as she was affectionately called by her siblings, preceded "Lizzie," in death. One of Elizabeth's greatest joys was her family.
