Elizabeth Whitaker Jackson, the daughter of the late Rozenna Knight and the late Africa Whitaker, was born on July 12, 1916 in Enfield, North Carolina. While she was still quite young, her parents relocated to Suffolk, Virginia, where she received her formal education in Suffolk City Schools. At an early age, she accepted Christ and was baptized into the fellowship of the Christian Church where she served faithfully. She was joined in holy matrimony to William R. Jackson on December 31, 1935. From this union, four children were born. She was united with Israel Baptist Church in Baltimore where she faithfully served as a missionary, choir member, and member of the Hospitality Committee.
