Elizabeth West Taylor, lovingly known as “Stumpy,” daughter of the late James W. and Hassie West was born December 17, 1925 in Baltimore, Maryland. She went home to be with the Lord on Friday, October 1, 2004 after a lengthy illness. She received her education in the Baltimore City Schools. She married Emerson Taylor on July 21, 1956, who preceded her in death in 1994. Elizabeth considered Emerson to be her best friend. Elizabeth worked as a cook and a housekeeper for various families in Baltimore. She loved to entertain her family and was best known for her recipes brisket of beef, pound cakes and gelatin mold. She accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at the Ebenezer Baptist Church. She later attended the Salem Baptist Church. Elizabeth loved music and dancing. She continued to tap her feet even when her knees began to fail her. She had an exuberant spirit and did not let illness or trouble get her down. She underwent knee replacement surgery in 1995 and was voted rehabilitation patient of the year by Maryland General Hospital. This was an honor she was most proud of. In more recent years, Elizabeth lived at the Ruscombe Gardens Senior Apartments where she made numerous friends. She had a devoted friend in Charles who assisted her when she did not feel well. Elizabeth enjoyed participating in the many bus excursions sponsored by the apartment complex. These excursions took her to area malls, cultural events and to the Inner Harbor. Elizabeth was a devoted wife and mother, and she was especially close to her sister Alberta. She was preceded in death by her brothers John and James West. She leaves

to mourn, one son, Robert West; three sisters, Alberta West, Gladys Watties, Madeline "Betty" Hobbs; one grandson, Daryl West; one great-granddaughter, Nakita West; one sister-in-law, Catherine West; two brothers-in-law, Allen Watties and LeRoy Hobbs; several nieces and nephews and a host of relatives and friends.
