OLUWATOYIN AKEJU, daughter of the late Oladipupo M. and Latifat Mayungbe, was born on May 28, 1953 in Ibadan, Nigeria. She suddenly departed this life on June 26, 2005. She received her elementary education at Agbeni Methodist School in Ibadan. She received her high school education at Renaissance High School, also in Ibadan, Nigeria. At the age of eighteen, she joined her mother, Mrs. Latifat Mayungbe, in the business of importing and exporting of rice from Thailand and other countries for six years. She later started her own business of importing rice from Thailand. From 1977-2003 (when she came to the United States), she was what Nigerians call "A Trader or A Business Woman". Even though Oluwatoyin was born into a Muslim family, she embraced Christianity at a tender age of twelve and has since remained devoted and dedicated to her faith up until her last day on earth. She married Mr. Emmanuel Akintunde Akeju, and they had three children, Olajumoke, Abiola and Olanrewaju. Oluwatoyin made numerous friends wherever she went and will be sincerely missed by everyone whose life she has touched. She was always a trustworthy person, a devoted family woman and a God-fearing human being.
