April 3, 1915 - October 7, 2015

Ella Williams, daughter of the late Albert and Mary Jane (Edwards) Williams, was born on April 3, 1915, in Monroe County, Alabama. She departed this life on October 7, 2015.

Ella obeyed the gospel in 1932, in Pensacola, Florida. Mamie Holmes was one of her Sunday school teachers. It was there where she met Mamie's son, Thomas Lee Williams. Ella and Thomas Lee were married on January 16, 1934, in Pensacola, Florida. Thomas Lee departed this life on June 10, 1974 and Mamie on April 17, 1976. She loved them all, and they loved her back.

The Lord gave her a kind and gently spirit which was displayed in the manner in which she lived her life. All who knew her can attest that she would never speak an ill word against anyone. She encouraged her children to remember that love is what matters most in life. She lived her life by example using few words, but many deeds to show them how to live in love.

God gave her one hundred years, six months and four days in this world.

She is preceded in death by: her father and mother as well as all of her siblings, Mamie (Spencer Tucker), Andrew (Mattie Wiggins), John Neal (Carrie Snider), Lydia (Roberts Tann), Coleman (Annie Pearl Cooper), Lester, Sr. (Sarah Campbell), and Alvin (Geraldine Brown). She is also preceded in death by her dear friend, Lillian Foster.
