My Bachelor of Science Degree was received from North Carolina A&T University. My major was Institutional Home Economics.

God Blessed me to have work experience at L. Richardson Memorial Hospital in Greensboro, North Carolina, St. Luke's hospital in New York, Baltimore City Hospital, Baltimore City Community College and the Maryland State Health Department.

The best, yet to come - I was born again at the age of fourteen on Mother's

Day in Queens Chapel F.W.B. Church in Vanceboro, North Carolina. I served as the Sunday School Secretary, sang in the choir and played the piano for several Junior and Senior Choirs throughout the Vanceboro area.
