Ellen C. Carter, daughter of the late David A. Bryant and Martha Brown, was born on September 23, 1921 in New Rochelle, New York. She departed this life on February 27, 2007, after a lengthy illness. She received her education at Pomonkey High School in Bryans Road, Maryland and graduated in 1939. She moved to Baltimore in 1940 and worked at Union News at Penn Station until she retired in 1990 as a waitress. She married DeWitt Q. Carter on December 30, 1946 who preceded her in death. Also, her loving sister, Muriel A. Sheppard, preceded her in death. She was baptized as a child and was a devout Catholic who regularly attended the 10 a.m. service at St. Ann's Church for approximately twenty years. She would always talk about the choir and how well they sang and especially after she was able to attend the 133rd Rededication Service on October 22, 2006. Ellen was affectionately known as "Aunt Ellen" or "Cousin Ellen." She loved to entertain especially family and friends when they would come to "Club Muriels" as her house was called.
