Ellen Christine Ford, daughter of the late William and Sallie Smith, was born on December 19, 1924, in Smithfield, North Carolina. On November 25, 2003 at the breakfast hour, God summoned Ellen's angel to escort her to her heavenly home. Ellen received her education in the North Carolina public schools. In 1938 Ellen met and married the late Thomas Ford, Sr. From this union five children were born: four girls, Lillie (who preceded her in death), Elsie, Sallie and Christine; and one son, Thomas Jr. At an early age, Ellen dedicated her life to Jesus Christ. She joined the Church of God in Jesus Christ in Fewqay Fetina, North Carolina under the late Bishop Faison. Ellen and her family relocated to Baltimore, Maryland in 1951. She continued her fellowship with the Church of God in Jesus Christ, now under the leadership of Pastor Ginadus Winston. Ellen was a good and humble soldier for the Lord. On March 4, 1951, Ellen was appointed to "The Lord's Ministry." Several pastors preceded her in death. Steadfast, she faithfully continued to serve "God," "The Lord," "Jesus Christ." Ellen was a good cook. She worked for the Baltimore City Public School System.
