ELLEN B. LYLE was born in Greenville, South Carolina, July 9, 1909 to the late Mable and Henry Mosley. She departed this life on Saturday, January 28, 2006 at Sinai Hospital after a brief illness. Ellen's parents died when she was very young, and she was reared by her aunt, Margaret Allen. In 1918 Ellen moved to Baltimore, Maryland with her aunt and uncle. She attended elementary school in Greenville, South Carolina and received the rest of her education in Baltimore City public schools. Ellen gave her life to Christ while she was still in South Carolina. Upon moving to Baltimore, she joined Mount Olivet Christian Church, where she was a faithful member as well as an ardent worker for more than forty-two years. After the death of her husband, she decided to join a church closer to her home. In 1978 Brown's Memorial Baptist Church became Ellen's church home. She attended church fervently until her health failed her. At an early age, Ellen began working, and she worked for over fifty years. During this time Ellen worked for the Dorsey family and helped to raise their three sons, Scott, Gary and Michael (deceased). Ellen and the Dorsey family shared a special relationship that continued until she departed this life. Ellen loved shopping, traveling, dining out and cooking. She enjoyed entertaining and spending quality time with her friends. She leaves to cherish her memory: her goddaughter, April Newman; and special friends, Ester Jordan, Cassandra Hice, Monica Walker, Jacqueline Mercer, Bridgett Harcum and Annie Maitland. Ellen had no living relatives, therefore her extended family filled the gap to take care of her needs as well as most of

her wants. Ellen will be greatly missed by all who knew her.
