He departed this life on October 13, 2007. He was loved by all that knew him. He was charming, intelligent and always had a smile and a story to tell. He will truly be missed. Many people in Baltimore knew “Mr. Elliott” as a gentleman and as a “Cook of Cooks.” People came from all around just to get some of Mr. Elliott’s “good ole fried chicken” or his crab cakes and fried fish. He put love into his cooking and into the things he said and did. Not only was Mr. Elliott a great cook, he was also a carpenter by trade. While many knew him as the cook for Melba’s Place, few knew that he did the remodeling of the restaurant. He was truly a master of many trades. As a youth, Elliott was known as a smart, fun loving person. On October 10, 1954 he married the late Evelyn Juanita Harrison. Elliott and Evelyn had three children: Vanessa, who preceded them both in death, Ellen and Elliott, Jr. Elliott served in the United States Army and traveled the world. He was a boxer in the Army and was respected by those that he served with. After leaving the Army, he worked at several restaurants and hotel establishments. He worked at Allied Chemical Company for many years before moving on to work at the College of Notre Dame, where he earned distinguished awards for his hard work and dedication. When he retired from the college, his boss was so moved that he

cried and expressed how much he was going to miss Elliott. He earned so much respect from his employers and co-workers that he was asked to be the Shop Steward on several of his jobs, taking on other workers' grievances and fighting for them as though he were fighting for himself.
