Stanley worked for the post office as a letter carrier for more than thirty-five years and he retired from the Catonsville post office in 1978. Stanley had many hobbies; he especially loved ham radio, talking to many folks around the world, boating and making clocks. All of his life he loved to make things. For example, he built the house his wife and girls lived in, and even as he got older and his back grew weak and his legs were failing, he built a wheel chair lift for his truck so he could continue to get out and about. Stanley loved to tell stories, sometimes “tall tales” and also he loved to tell jokes and riddles. Stanley was a devoted husband to Frances for more than sixty-one years; he was a wonderful father to “his girls” and a dotting grandfather and great-grandfather. Stanley leaves behind to mourn him: two loving and devoted daughters, Frances Barron and Phyllis Sharps; two sons-in-law, Henry Barron and Percell Sharps; four grandchildren Aaron H.
