October 27, 1926 - January 21, 2021

After a brief illness on the morning of January 21, 2021 at 4:00 a.m. at the Sinai Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, Deaconess Eloise Harris took the Master's hand and entered into her eternal home - HEAVEN.

DEACONESS ELOISE HARRIS was born on October 27, 1926 to the late Will and Ella Ross of Salisbury, North Carolina. Eloise was the third child of six siblings.

Eloise was educated in the public schools of Salisbury, N.C.

Eloise moved to Baltimore, Maryland and was a loyal employee of the Central Laundry Co. from which she retired after working for 30 years.

Eloise married the love of her life Deacon Herman Harris on January 3, 1976. They enjoyed thirty-seven years of love and commitment to each other.

Deaconess Harris joined the First Baptist Church of Cherry Hill and was baptized on February 6, 1976 under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Henry Simon, and continued her membership under Rev. Joel M. Small. She was devoted to her church and loved her church family. Deaconess Harris was a member of the former Pastor Aide Ministry, the Mass Choir, the Vocal Choir, and the Deaconess Ministry. Deaconess Harris contributed cheerfully and supported

her church up until her death. Because of her love for her niece, Deaconess Josephine Fields (whom she called her daughter), she would support the Christian Unity Temple CC Church of Baltimore also. Deaconess Harris would help anyone in need and was generous to many.

Deaconess Harris enjoyed reading the bible, listening to her Pastor's telephone broadcasts on Sundays and Wednesdays, watching Bishop Dale Bronner's (Word of Faith Cathedral) television broadcasts, talking with her family and church members on the telephone, watching TV (her favorite show was Dancing with the Stars) and she loved some POPEYE'S chicken and the Baltimore Ravens.

He healed her wounded spirit, and owned her as His Child.

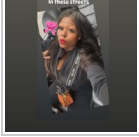
