In 1970, Eloise met and fell in love with the "Love of Her Life", John Albert Demory. They had a lasting and loving relationship that existed for more than 35 years. In 1973, one bouncing, baby girl was born from this union, Danielle (Dainty). For many years, John and

Eloise traveled in and out of the United States. They also took family trips with their children to Kings Dominion, Hershey Park, Connecticut and Florida. Family birthday celebrations and Thanksgiving and Christmas Holidays were times of great sharing and fun for their household. Providing a loving and caring environment for their family was most important to their way of life. Eloise adored her husband, children, grandchildren, great grandchildren and stepchildren. The word "Family" to Eloise was an inclusive word. She was very family oriented-a very loving, caring and wonderful mother who had strong family values and continuously went beyond the call of duty to care for her loved ones. Eloise was an equally dedicated and loving daughter to her late mother, Mary. There were many occasions when Eloise provided transportation for the many shopping trips to the grocery store where she and her mother would shop until they dropped. Moriah Baptist Church in a beautiful wedding ceremony, which was followed by a lovely wedding reception for their closest family and friends. Eloise was a very beautiful bride! Eloise's lifelong career entailed employment for a short period of time at the Baltimore City School System's Disabled Kids Program. appreciation to her for helping them with their problems. In December 2003, she elected to take an early retirement so she would be able to properly care for her ailing mother and husband.
