ELOISE WILLIAMS TRAMMEL, daughter of the late James Henry Williams and Janie Bell Richie Williams, was born May 13, 1918 in Greenwood, South Carolina. She transitioned to be with the Lord on November 17, 2015. Eloise was baptized at the Mt. Olive Baptist Church. She was educated in Abbeville, South Carolina and graduated from Poplar Grove High School in 1936. After graduation she joined her sister, Lula, in Baltimore, MD., arriving on Friday and joining Enon Baptist Church on Sunday.

She often spoke of memories of marching from the old church on Park Ave. to the present site on Edmondson Ave. During her almost 80-year membership at Enon, she sang on the Intermediate and Sanctuary Choirs for many years. She was a dedicated member of the Cheerful Givers and the Grandison Seniors. Eloise loved her church and enjoyed assisting in any way possible in the support of the ministry and the Pastors.

Though her first marriage to Alonzo Byrd, ended in divorce she continued to raise her daughter, Myra Byrd with loving assistance from her sister, Lula. Eloise was a loving and devoted mother who attended to her daughter's every need. She was an ardent supporter of The Association of Retarded Citizens. In 1956, she married the love of her life, Napoleon Trammel. Together they traveled in and out of the country and enjoyed life and happiness until his death.

Eloise was employed with the Baltimore City Public School System as a Supervisor/ Cafeteria Manager, retiring after sixteen years. She took pleasure in her relationship with neighbors in the Bentalou St. Neighborhood Club as well as the Waxter Center for Seniors. She has impacted many lives during her ninety-seven years with her loving, caring and attentive spirit. Her family, husband, Napoleon Trammel; daughter, Myra Byrd; and sister, Lula Williams all preceded her in death. However, she has many friends, neighbors and church family to celebrate her life and remember the good times shared.
