LOUISE EVERSON (Jones), the seventh of nine children born to the late Zadie and William Henry Jones; was born on June 16, 1929 in Barnwell, SC. The entire family worshiped at the Great Cypress Baptist Church. She was educated in the Barnwell Public School System. Once her family moved to Bridgeton, New Jersey, they worshipped at Union Temple Baptist Church. She furthered her education in the Bridgeton New Jersey Public School System. She started working at P.J. Ridders Canning Factory in Bridgeton, NJ at the young age of 15.

Elouise (affectionately called “Lou”) relocated to Baltimore, MD in 1949 in search of employment. She was employed at the Lako Factory and was befriended by two sisters, Rebecca and Marie Everson. While visiting them at their home, she met their brother, Herbert Lee Everson; not realizing that he would eventually sweep her off her feet. On November 26, 1954, she was joined in Holy Matrimony with Herbert, the love of her life, and this union was blessed with five children: Linda, Yvonne (deceased), Garrick, Duane, and Andrea.

In 1952, she became a member of The Sweet Hope Free Will Baptist Church under the pastoral leadership of the late Reverend Paul Andrew Hodges. She served the Lord at Sweet Hope as a member of the Senior Usher Board. She also served in leadership capacities as the Flower Circle

Vice-President, Noonday Bible Class Teacher, Sunday School Teacher (High School Class), Senior Choir #1 Vice-President, and the Mothers' Board Co-Chairman. She also served under the pastoral leadership of the late Reverend John T. Crummedy. Pastor Crummedy nicknamed Mother Everson "Soldier" because she was diligent in letting him and others know "The Word", when they stepped out of line; always with love of course.

Once all of her children were born, Elouise stayed at home and took care of her family and her home. She enjoyed various hobbies such as embroidering, reading, cooking, baking and working in both her flower and vegetable gardens. She loved uplifting worship, life-changing teaching and inspiring preaching. She loved the Word of God and loved to sing. She loved to sing so much she joined a group called The Determinettes and served as their President.

She was also active in her community in Northwest Baltimore. Elouise was a Lifetime Member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) working diligently for women's right to vote.

Elouise was a very lovely person. She had a large heart and reached out to many. She was an excellent financial manager and made the income work well for her family. Her family was her heartbeat. She enjoyed spending time and laughing with them. She believed that a good laugh does a body good.

This Queen loved to "hit the road" with her King. They travelled to Canada, various other countries as well as across the United States in "anything smokin"; car, train, plane, or cruise ship. Life was good and they enjoyed it immensely.

On December 6, 2021, Elouise took the Wings of the Morning and went to be with the Lord whom she served with all her heart and soul. Her presence is already missed.

She was preceded in death by her brothers, Huron Carter, Joe Henry Carter, Freddie Carter, William Jones and James Jones; her sisters, Kathleen Carter, Minnie Lee Little, Caroline Wilson; and daughter, Yvonne.

Elouise leaves to cherish and embrace her memory: her committed, charming and adoring husband, Herbert Lee; four devoted children, Linda Mosley, Garrick (Maria), Duane (April) and Andrea; ten grandchildren, Corey, Troy, Scipio, Tysheka, Katrina, Marcus, Dominique, Biko, Amanda and Toshiba; fourteen great-grandchildren; two devoted sisters-in-law, Ida Newman of Silver Spring, MD and Irene Davis of Petersburg, VA; spiritual son, Deacon Herman Johnson, Jr.; numerous godchildren including the late Elder Karen Brown; many who called her Mother, her Sweet Hope Church family, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.
