ELVIN GALLOP, son of the late James Lewis Gallop and Bettie Bernard, was born on April 2, 1921 in Shiloh, North Carolina. He departed this life into eternal rest on Sunday, July 17, 2011 at his home.

As a World War II Veteran, he served in the United States Army under The Black Army/ Air Corps Units stationed in the United Kingdom. Elvin's unit was called the 4045th Quartermaster Truck Company, European Theatre of Operations located at Merley Park. The duties of this company were to drive, service, and maintain light trucks, haul military supplies and equipment under combat conditions during blackouts, and over rough terrain.

He married the former Rose Marie Jackson. At her time of death they were married over forty years.

He worked many years and retired from the Veterans Administration Hospital in Baltimore in 1984. He utilized time during his retirement to serve as an usher on the Usher Board at St. Cecilia Catholic Church. Also, Elvin would volunteer time to whoever needed his assistance. He made numerous friends wherever he went, and was a true friend and devoted family man. He will be sincerely missed by all.
