Emma Georgianna Scott Johnson, daughter of the late Howard Scott and the late Clare Scott Smalls, was born on January 29, 1919 in Baltimore, Maryland. Emma was the third child born of that union. Emma received her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools. She married Alfred Edward Johnson on December 25, 1934. To this union five children were born, Clara Jackson and Delores Colbert (who preceded her in death.) Lillian Jennings, Alfred Johnson and Joyce Pollard. Emma attended Old Asbury as a child and Christ Methodist Church, now known as Christ United Methodist Church, where she remained a member until her death. Emma was a member of the Flower Circle and attended band services. She was devoted to her family, friends and community, and sought to quietly lead by example. She genuinely cared for her neighbors and was always willing to lend a helping hand. She loved cooking and having people come over to enjoy her cooking. She always had a smile and a hug for her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Emma enjoyed traveling and would frequently take her grandchildren on trips both far and near with her. Emma was employed at the Muncie Building for a number of years and then spent the next thirty years with the General Service Administration at the Social Security Administration in Woodlawn. Later in life, as her health deteriorated, Emma became housebound. Her faith in God never diminished and she daily gave thanks and praises to God. She enjoyed the monthly visits by the Sick Committee and often joined in song and praise with them. On June 20, 2009, Emma gently slipped away to go home to “be

with her Lord."She is survived by: two daughters Lillian Jennings and Joyce Pollard and one son Alfred Edward Johnson, all of whom provided unwavering care and love for her during her extensive illness in addition to her grandchildren Mark and Jocelyn Pollard; two sisters, Elaine Alexander and Regina Cook; brother-in-law, Allen Cook; aunt, Mildred Lane; daughter-in-law, Virginia Johnson; fourteen grandchildren, seventeen great-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and other relatives
