EMMA L. WILSON, daughter of the late Irvin and Emma Johnson, was born on January 5, 1924 in Sparks, Maryland. After a full and fruitful life of 97 years she was called to her heavenly home on February 8, 2021.

Before moving to Baltimore with her family, Emma received her education in the Sparks County Public School System and then attended Paul Laurence Dunbar High School in Baltimore, Maryland.

Emma married Alexander Wilson, whom she affectionately called "Sonny", on June 14, 1940. From their blessed union three children were born, Constance, Irvin and Calvin.

She was employed with the Baltimore City Public School System for over 30 years. During her long career there she worked diligently as a custodial worker in the janitorial services department.

Emma received her spiritual foundation early in life. She was a life-long member of Oak Street African Methodist Episcopal Church. She was a member of the Flower Circle, The Missionary Society, The Helping Hands, and served faithfully as a Stewardess along with her two best friends, Mrs. Mary L. Winder and the late Mrs. Mildred Whittington,

known as the Oak Street “Golden Girls.” Over the years, Sis. Wilson, as the members lovingly called her, made many endearing relationships with both old and young. You could often catch her reminiscing with others about the days of old on Howard Street.

Mama, Grandma Wilson, Aunt Feddie, Cousin Emma, Mrs. Wilson (whatever name your relationship to her called for) had a strong personality and was never one to bite her tongue or mince her words. Although she would always give it to you straight; it is because she had a very strong love for her family, friends and those close to her heart.

Emma was the last of seven children to receive her eternal rest. She was also preceded in death by her husband of 72 years, Alexander “Sonny” Wilson and their son, Irvin Wilson.

She leaves to cherish her memory: one daughter, Constance Jordan; one son, Calvin Wilson; ten grandchildren, several great and great-greatgrandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.

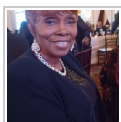
