Eric Jackson, was born on November 21, 1946, in New York, New York son of the late Sara and Hubert Jackson who precedes him in death. Eric departed this life on Tuesday, April 28, 2026. He also was preceded in death by his wife Brenda, 2 sisters Barbara Jackson, and Patricia Teams and 2 brothers Hubert and Lawrence Jackson.

He grew up with strong values that carried him through every chapter of life- from his early years, and to raising a family of his own. In 1959, at the age of 13, Eric met the love of his life, Brenda J. Jackson. Their bond grew into a lifelong partnership built on love, faith, and devotion. From their union, they were blessed with three amazing children, who became the pride and joy of his life. In 2021, his heart broke when she suddenly departed this life.

Eric graduation from Benjamin Franklin High School in 1964. On August 18, 1966, Eric was drafted into the Army. He completed basic training in Fort Gordon, GA and was a member of the Foxtrot Company. Eric served in Vietnam, assigned to the 196th Light Infantry Brigade, American Division as a Radio Transmitter Officer (RTO). For his service and the injury, he sustained in the war, he was rightfully awarded a Purple Heart. He then went to Fordham University in Bronx, NY, Morgan State in Baltimore, MD, and some online courses to further his education. In 1990. he worked as a youth

counselor. Working in group homes for young troubled youth, to Northwest Baltimore Youth Services where he retired from in 2012.

Beyond his work, Eric was a devoted husband, a loving father, a proud grandfather, great grandfather, and a loyal friend. He cherished time spent at family gatherings, where laughter, love, and togetherness meant the most to him. Whether sharing stories, offering guidance, or simply enjoying the presence of those he loved. Eric made every moment meaningful. He also loved football, so much that he helped start a neighborhood football league which he played in until the late 80s. His love for the game and determination to calm the tension in the city, was accomplished by the football league they created in the 70's.

Though he is no longer with us, his legacy lives on in the values he taught, the love he gave, and the lives he touched. His memory will remain forever in our hearts.

Eric leaves behind to cherish his memories his eldest sister Betty Coleman. His 3 children Eric II, Nikko, and Lance I(Aiesha) 9 grandchildren Shiniqua, Latia, N.
