The weight of what Eric has endured would break most people. Eric not only takes on the challenges he gets thrown at him, but sacrifices a lot which we all take for granted in our day to day lives. All of that boils down to strength.

And it is by calling on Eric's strength that we can all find comfort in the fact that Eric is no longer in pain. Eric no longer has to carry that

weight. Eric is safe in God's hands.
