Erma attended the Baltimore City Public Schools and completed her high school education by obtaining a General Education Degree. After receiving her GED, she chose to tutor others to complete their GED.

She worked for a short time at the Johns Hopkins Hospital and retired from the Baltimore City Department of Education after 33 years. She was very compassionate, warmhearted, kind and caring person. If you needed a helping hand, a meal, a kind word or a friend, she would readily give it or be there for you.

Erma met and married into Holy Matrimony with Walter J. Hunter in March 1945, of this union, five children were born. Erma was very much devoted to her husband, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren as well as her extended family including in-laws, nieces and nephews.
