Mrs. Smith was born to Professor Ora Paige Marshall and Corrie Marshall in Learned, Mississippi. She is a product of a loving, caring, and nurturing community of Paige Grove community where every need was supplied by the community members. After high school, Mrs. Smith moved to Minneapolis, MN where her brother, Mr. Edgar Marshall paved the way for her to gain employment and continue post secondary training. Following her brother to Chicago, Illinois, Ernestine met her husband, Mr. John H. Smith. They married March 10, 1956 and moved to Baltimore, Maryland. While living there, John's sister, Mrs. Lucille Smith Vernon passed away leaving her husband Mr. Edward Vernon Sr. with eight beautiful children. John and Ernestine raised the youngest three, Lucille, Edward Jr., and Deborah, which required tremendous sacrifices of time and finances. They stayed committed to all eight children; majority of the remaining five (Barbara, Christine, Martha, Esther and Elnora) at some point in their lives were recipients of John's and Ernestine's generosity, spending time in their home. These unselfish acts demonstrated their love for children. Ernestine's nieces and nephews on the Marshall side of the family enjoyed many summers vacationing at her home. Sister Steen shared her finances with her siblings and supported their children collectively and individually.

Ernestine was truly a remarkable woman of God who faithfully served on boards, auxiliaries and choirs at First Baptist Church in Baltimore.
