Esander Loney, Jr., beloved son of the late Esander Loney, Sr. and Helen Cecilia Loney, entered the world on February 23, 1953, in Baltimore, Maryland. God, in his infinite compassion and mercy, called him to rest on Monday, November 17, 2025. Surrounded by family, he quietly and peacefully answered God's call to eternal life.

"Juice," as he was affectionately known, Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at a young age and attended St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church in Baltimore. He received his formal education at Patterson High School, graduating in 1970. He was widely recognized for his remarkable athletic abilities in wrestling, football, and baseball.

Even as a teenager, Juice understood discipline, commitment, and sacrifice-qualities that would carry him in life. Offered a full wrestling scholar to Morgan State University, he chose instead to step into the workforce to help provide for his parents and siblings. For him, family came first. Always

Immediately after high school, Juice began working for the City of Baltimore, faithfully serving for more than 25 years. Later he obtained his CDL and stepped into a second successful career with DHL. In 2015, after decades of rarely missing a day of work, he retired-a well-deserved rest for a man who had given so much.

His leadership extended far beyond the workplace. Juice coached youth baseball at Madison Square Recreation Center, where his teams won multiple championships. More importantly, he mentored young men-teaching them discipline, teamwork, and the truth that hard work builds character.

Becoming a father at a young age shaped much of Juice's journey. He cherished his oldest daughter, Sharonda Loney. He later shared a 24 -year marriage with Brenda Loney, with whom he welcomed three additional children: Lessie Loney Abron, Esander Loney III, and Brandon Loney.

In 2003, Juice found everlasting love and Partnership when he married Gloria. Together, they shared 22 years of marriage, camping trips, laughter, companionship, and many unforgettable memories that will be cherished forever.

Juice was also a proud member of the Van Maters Club, where he won numerous trophies and awards for his creativity and craftsmanship.

A devoted Baltimore Ravens fan, Juice approached football season with the same passion he brought to life. Sundays were -filled with slow-cooked roasts, old school slow jams, and a home full of family and friends stopping by for good food and conversation. Whether watching westerns, tuning into Maury, or debating sports and politics, Juice knew how to make people feel welcome.

In his neighborhood, he was a familiar presence. Until his passing, he could often be seen sitting on his front steps on Preston Street, waving at cars that honked and greeting everyone who passed by. His presence was a comfort, a constant, and a piece of the community heartbeat.

When November 17, arrived, Juice stepped into overtime-not in defeat, but in

triumphs. Surrounded by love, he fought the good fight, finished his race, and won the ultimate championship: eternal life with his Savior. The final whistle sounded here on earth, but his victory celebration began in glory.

He was preceded in death by his parents Esander, Sr and Helen Loney three brothers, Kenneth "Kenny" Jeffrey, and Dwain Loney; and two sisters, Sharon Loney and Sandra Loney.

Juice Leaves to cherish his memory his loving and devoted wife, Gloria Loney; his daughters, Sharonda Loney and Lessie Loney Abron (Dante); his sons, Esander Loney III and Brandon Loney; and his stepsons, Raymond Edwards and Michael Edwards.
