She was educated in the public schools of Chester, South Carolina and later moved to Baltimore, Maryland as the family migrated north to find better opportunities. She studied Cosmetology at Carver Vocational Technical High School and worked in the field for several years. She later became employed as a Waitress in the restaurant of Hoschild Kohn's Department Store, a position she held until she retired. She met the dashing Edward McCullough and in 1950 the couple was married. Although no children were born to this union, the couple took to their nieces and nephews as though they were their own. Estelle gave her life to Christ as a young girl in South Carolina. When the family moved to Baltimore she continued in the family's A.M.E. Zion heritage and tradition, taking root in the Pennsylvania Avenue A.M.E. Zion Church. She was member of the Young Women's Progressive Club, the Life Members Council, and a faithful member of the Usher Board until age and illness prevented her from serving. She loved attending church and she loved her church family. "Hess" as she was known by her family, loved all of her family and shared a close bond with her sisters and brother all who predeceased

her. She loved to laugh and had a great sense of humor. She loved to entertain and for many years her house was the place for 4th of July cookouts and Thanksgiving dinner.
