ETHEL McCREE HALL, the eleventh of fourteen children of the late George and Katie McCree, was born on April 12, 1909 in Council, North Carolina. After ninety-seven years of a vibrant life, she slipped away during her sleep on Friday, November 3, 2006. "Gram," as she was affectionately called by her family, was educated in Council, North Carolina. She was married to the late John Hall, Sr. and from that union they enjoyed raising their two sons; the late John, Jr. and Allen, three daughters; the late Edna, Pearl and Beatrice. Gram loved exquisite desserts and was an avid baker of sumptuous cakes and pies. Two of her specialties were the three-layered coconut cake and delicious pecan pies. Ethel was also quite a dresser. All those who knew her marveled at her dapper sense of fashion and meticulous style. She was a skilled and keen seamstress. Ethel accepted Christ at an early age. After relocating to Wilmington, North Carolina, she continued her Christian experience by serving as the choir director and Sunday School teacher. Later Gram moved to Baltimore where she joined the Edmonson Heights S.D.A. church under the pastorate of Pastor Alfred Johnson. There, she enjoyed ministering as one of the Deaconess and a faithful Sabbath School member. Gram's day began routinely with the reading of scriptures. She was a very compassionate individual with a quiet demeanor, often seeking to make life just a little bit easier for her family and neighbors. It was not uncommon to see her reaching out to touch the lives of tenants in her apartment complex. Her service to God continued weekly as she led a large number of the tenants through prayer,

bible study and worship. Gram's memory will be forever embedded in the hearts of many. She leaves to cherish her memory: two devoted daughters, Pearl Abrams and Beatrice Banks, one devoted son, Allen Hall; one loving sister, Annie Mae Dyson; thirty grandchildren, many great-grandchildren, great great-grandchildren and a host of extended family and friends.
