They remained happily married for thirty-six years. Known affectionately as "Mac" by his wife, Eugene was a devoted and caring husband. This quality only increased when he and Augustine completed their family with the births of their two children, Eugene "Alex" McGill Jr. and Katheryn McGill. Eugene continued his professional pursuits by securing a position at Verizon. His career as a real estate specialist culminated with his retirement in 1997 after thirty years of dedicated service. Eugene's strong sense of commitment and caring was displayed even in business. He was so passionate about enriching the lives of others that in the mid 90's he formed an investment club to share his sound financial principles and to increase the quality of life for family and friends. In addition to that, he

was also a member of the National Association of Tax Practitioners. His interest in securing financial stability for his family and others didn't stop there. After his retirement, Eugene and Augustine launched a business franchise, opening three Jackson Hewitt Tax Offices.
