Eugene Robert Hall, lovingly known as “Blue” was born on August 26, 1958 in Baltimore, MD. Eugene was the youngest of three beautiful children born to the late, Ella Mae and Herman Herbert Hall. After a brief illness, Eugene slipped away peacefully surrounded by his Family on Sunday, March 05, 2017 at 10:48 am.

Eugene attended Saint Pius V and Saint Martin’s Elementary School. Eugene was taught at a very early age the importance of serving the Lord. He and his cousin, Billy served as altar boys while at Saint Martin’s Elementary. Eugene graduated from Mount Saint Joe in 1976. After graduating high school Eugene enlisted in the United States Army Infantry Unit and served as an expert in explosives as well as a sharp shooter. Eugene completed two tours, in Hawaii and Korea. It was in Korea that he received the Bronze Medal for Bravery for being 1 of 3 Men who were instrumental in saving the lives of their entire platoon. Eugene was honorably discharged in 1980.

In 1981, Eugene became a father with the birth of his first born LaTiece, then again in 1989 when his youngest son, Dante was born. He loved his family dearly; being the only son with 2 sisters, Eugene felt it was his duty to protect his family. As his family grew, so did his determination for being our protector and unending supporter. The importance of family was everything, which was shown not in his talk, but his walk. He would give you, “the shirt off his back”.

Eugene loved to grill and was considered the, "Family's Grill Master"; rain, snow, sleet or shine it was always a good time to grill. Eugene took his position as his family's Patriarch seriously and would go above & beyond the call of duty to make sure that anything he could do to help, he would and continued to do up until his brief illness in January.

Eugene had many travels in his life and in 2006, his paths lead him to Perryville, MD; where he recommitted and re-established his position in the "Army of the Lord".

In 2009, Eugene gained another branch to his Family Tree, when he became a member at, Room at the Cross Mission Church. He was on the board of Trustee's; he also stood along side Pastor Savage, the First Lady and other congregation members that ministry to others, relaying the message, "that it is room at the cross for all".

Eugene held several jobs over his lifetime, but, one of his most important jobs was that of a brother and son. In 2013, Eugene beloved mother, Ella Mae fell ill; he stood along side his sisters while their cared for their Mother until her passing in June of the same year. After the passing of his Mother, Eugene decided to stay in Baltimore to be closer to his Family.

Eugene was so many things, to so many people, so many lives touched by our," Guardian Angel"; so many memories that we are blessed to have had. We find strength in the words Eugene stated while he stood at the foot of his mother's grave, "We are not giving up and we are not giving in."

Eugene leaves to celebrate his life, two devoted sisters, Lottie Dorsey, Loretta Hall-Opstrup, one brother –in- law, Keith Dorsey, one sister- in- law, Terri Esterline. His fiancée, Michelle Dixon, his beloved sons, Latiece Daniels &

Dante Hall, two daughters- in- law, Nina Daniels & Iris Hall, three grandsons, Tyrell, Christopher & Emmanuel Daniels, two Aunts, Hazel Charles and Essie Hammond.
