The staff became her extended family, showing and giving Cookie exceptional love and care. Even with all the love

Cookie was the gift that we could never have wished for, imagined or even expected to receive in this lifetime, but always wanted. She never complained. We will miss her laughter, smile and her adventurous spirit.
