Eva Lavender Milligin, affectionately called Sissy, began her earthly journey on April 8, 1936 in Wilbury, Clarendon, Jamaica, as the beloved daughter of Lillian and Joseph Milligin. She brought immense joy to her family and excelled academically at Croft's Hill Primary School, mastering literacy and numeracy. After graduating, she learned embroidery and engaged in farming, showcasing her industrious nature. On June 5, 1968, she married the love her life, Astley Duncan and their union was full with love and devotion. In 1969, Sissy migrated to the United States where she worked as a babysitter while studying to become a nursing assistant. She later served at the Children's Hospital and St. Agnes Hospital until her retirement in 1995 due to health challenges. Known for her caring and fun-loving nature, she cherished family time, dominoes and cheering on the Baltimore Ravens and Orioles.

Sissy had a strong sense of adventure and a knack for making others feel special. She loved traveling and going on shopping trips, creating memories that brought joy to her loved ones. She delighted in sharing her wisdom, including helping her nephew Fenton navigate his first shopping trip for a girlfriend, a moment that left everyone laughing and cherishing her vibrant spirit. Her warmth, humor and generosity left a lasting impression on everyone she met.

Her Christian journey began at the Church of God of Prophecy in Croft's Hill,

Clarendon and continued when she moved to Baltimore. She attended several churches, serving as a Sunday School Teacher and missionary before finding her spiritual home at Fountain of Life Apostolic Pentecostal Church under the leadership of Bishop Apostle Emmerick Harriott. There, she became a minister and later an evangelist, dedicating her life to faith and service. Her unwavering devotion to GOD and her community inspired those around her and solidified her legacy as a woman of faith and love.

After 88 years, Sissy peacefully transitioned on January 8, 2025, to join those who had gone before her, including her parents, husband, Astley, son Leroy and several siblings. She leaves behind cherished memories with her surviving siblings, Daphne Prehay, Gloria Messam, Esmine Facey, Jacqueline Milligin and Vincent Milligin, as well as numerous nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
