



Evangelist Emma L. Wright

September 6, 1920 - May 16, 2002

On Thursday, May 16, 2002 at 2:15 p.m., God dispatched an angel to Mercy Hospital and touched the spirit of Evangelist Emma L. Wright and she took a flight from earth to Glory. She was born on September 6, 1920 to the late Deacon William Pate and Mother Amanda Powell in Baltimore, Maryland. She received her education in the Baltimore City Public School System. At an early age she joined Number 8 Church of God In Christ, where she was saved and filled with the Holy Ghost under the leadership of Elder Frank Parker. The church later became the Ebenezer Church of God in Christ. She was a member of the Adult Choir, Pastor's Aid, soloist, Ebenezer Gospel Singers, Y. P.W. W. and Sunday school. She met and later married Frank J. Wright on September 26, 1937 and to this union eleven children were born. She co-founded Pentecostal Church of Deliverance with Pastor Mattie L. Johnson and held such offices as Assistant Pastor, Youth President and Church Secretary. She was known as the "Little Woman of Faith." She was a Deliverance Evangelist and Revivalist on the East Coast. Her messages were given with boldness and zeal. She was always timely with messages such as "A to Z God," "I fought A Good Fight." "A Song At Midnight," "Arms Too Short To Box With God." " I'm Short But Determined" and Breaking Up Is Hard To Do." She loved good singing and was a soloist. You could hear her singing "Precious Lord," "My Record Will Be There" and "Without God." She also founded the Evangelistics and the Evangelistic Extension. She helped to build churches and Fellowshiped at various churches. She was a Pastor Backer and always

saw that the Pastor was taken care of.
