Evelyn attended Strayer Business University, Sojourner-Douglass College, and received a Geriatric Aid Certification from Anne Arundel Community College. She always believed in education.

Evelyn had several jobs. She worked as a seamstress and at Gulf Oil Company, which later became Chevron Oil, She retired from Chevron at age sixty-two.

Evelyn continued to work after her retirement from Chevron and was employed for eighteen years at Broadmead Continuing, Care Retirement Community. After eighteen years of dedicated service she retired once again on December 9, 2010.

born three children, Shirley Makell, Charles Ragin, Jr. who preceded her in death, and Michael Ragin.
