EVELYN RUBY SWANN, daughter of the late William and Ruby Banks, was born on May 25, 1941 in Baltimore, Maryland. She was raised on the East side of Baltimore City with her older sister, the late Constance R. Thompson and younger brother, William M. Banks, Jr. She departed this life on March 17, 2013 of natural causes quietly in her sleep.

She received her education in the Baltimore City Public School System in East Baltimore. After graduating from Paul Laurence Dunbar High School in June of 1959, she became a Nursing Assistant at Johns Hopkins Hospital. She later married her childhood sweetheart, Wiley H. Swann, and out of this union a set of fraternal boy twin was born, Kirk and Kelvin.

After the passing of her mother, Ruby Banks at the place of her employment, Johns Hopkins Hospital, she resigned and continued her education at Baltimore City Community College and received her Associate of Arts Degree.

She taught pre-schoolers for a couple of years and later started working at the Department of Social Services and remained there until her retirement. During her retirement, she went on various vacation trips with the entire family, various shopping trips in which she loved, and worked at the election polls as an election judge.

Evelyn was a true supportive and devoted wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother to her family.

She was preceded in death by her mother and father, Ruby and William Banks, Sr.; her oldest nephew, Vincent and sister, Constance Thompson.

She leaves to mourn: one brother, William Banks, Jr.; husband, Wiley Swann; two sons, Kirk and Kelvin; five grandchildren, Chanel, Kelly, Kirk Jr., Marquis and Kierron; one daughter-in-law, An-Jerletta Swann; four great-grandchildren, Christopher, Tyrell, Khyree and Tyshawn; two nieces, Drusilla and Vernita; one nephew, David Thompson; one aunt, Bertha Walker; and a host of other relatives and friends.
