REV. EVERETT T. THOMPSON, JR., son of the late Everett and Marie Daisy Thompson, was born on January 21, 1921 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, although he was raised in Wilmington, Delaware. He was the oldest of ten children, four boys and five girls. He departed this life on August 22, 2006. He received his education from Absalom Jones School, one of the founders of the A.M.E. Church. His culinary skills were served expertly at The Chesapeake, The Holiday Rooftop Inn, 3900, to name a few. He retired from Summit Country Club as a Master Chef in 1988. Rev. Thompson was an Associate Minister of Bethel A.M.E. Church in Baltimore, Maryland. He chaired the Ministry of Prayer, was an evangelist, led praise and worship groups, counseled, and other principles of spiritual growth. Ordained as a Deacon in 1991, he accepted the call to preach the gospel while he was a Steward at Bethel in 1984. He served four (4) years in the United States Army, including a tour of Germany from 1943 to 1947. He married the former Bessie O. Greene on August 3, 1967. Together, they devoted their lives to Jesus and the Church. Rev. Thompson strongly believed, "...not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think." (Romans 12:3) "Let your desires be His desires, and He will let His Will be done in you." He leaves to mourn his loving wife, Bessie O. Thompson; two sons, Pastor Wendell Thompson and Harold Thompson (Howard Thompson and Everett Thompson preceded him in death); four daughters, Eldress Ardrea Thompson, Minister Leslie Coles, Minister Linda Williams and Lisa Thompson; brother, Howard L. Thompson

(Harold Thompson, Oliver Thompson and Carl Thompson preceded him in death); two sisters, Hilda M. Thompson and Minnie T. Johnson (Barbara Colburn, Marguerite Guy and Constance Thompson preceded him in death); one daughter-in-law, two sons-in-law, three sisters-in-law, one brother-in-law, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, a host of other relatives and friends.
