



## Everette Calvin Johnson Sr.

September 29, 1946 - March 1, 2026

Pastor Everette Calvin Johnson Sr., 79, of Richmond, Virginia, peacefully passed away on March 1, 2026. Born on September 29, 1946, he grew up in the West End and was active in church and community youth programs. After graduating from Maggie L. Walker High School, he served honorably in the U.S. Air Force before beginning a long career with the U.S. Postal Service. Answering his call to ministry, Everette dedicated more than four decades to serving at Abundant Life Church of Christ and pastoring Abundant Life Victorious Church. His ministry extended across Africa, where he taught, preached, and appeared on Trinity Broadcasting Network.

He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Marjorie, and two siblings. Everette leaves behind his children, Daynia and Everette Jr., three sisters, grandchildren, a great-grandson, and many extended family members, spiritual children, and friends. Remembered as a devoted servant of God with a heart for missions, outreach, and evangelism, he lived a life guided by faith, humility, and a willingness to serve, always answering the call: "Here am I, Lord. Send me."
