To her family and friends, Evora was known for her humorous quips, which were demonstrated at every occasion. She was great at imitating the mannerisms and voice inflections of family members and friends.

Evora began her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools. To her mother's chagrin, she became known as "the class clown". As a result, Evora was transferred to the Catholic School system. She attended St. Francis Xavier Grade School and later, St. Frances Academy High School.

She had a small group of close friends. One friend in particular would pay Evora to accompany her on trips to the stores downtown, as the friend had a phobia against pigeons and chickens, which were displayed, live, in their cages.

Even though Evora was number five of six siblings, she was not intimidated by her elder siblings, or anyone else for that matter. Though she was not a bully, Evora was very strong, and at times felt it even necessary to physically protect her big brother.

Evora seemed to be content with the simple things in life. Many times she was not the least bit interested in family trips. As a matter of fact, she never even rode on a train.

She was very single minded and knew what she like, e.g., she always wanted dinner foods for breakfast the next day.

Her memory retention was such that she could easily recall minute details of things in the past and present.

Evora found joy in assisting others, especially seniors. She completed training as a nurse's aide, and worked in this field for many years.

She loved her cold drinks. She particularly enjoyed soda, to the point that her father once told her that he hoped when she became grown and owned a

house, she
wouldn't just sell the house for a carton of sodas.

She always took pride in her appearance. Those that knew her in her younger days, often commented that she had the figure of a model. It was later said that this
may have been the result of her love for extended walking.

Evora had many suitors, but did not agree to marry, until she realized that she truly wanted a family. She met, and on June 26, 1965 married Thomas Green. From
this union their sweet Timmy was born.

Evora struggled with ill health for many years, while maintaining an upbeat
and
positive spirit.

She was preceded in death by her two sisters, Alice Esters Wainwright Maddox
and Betty Esters Faidley Bacote; and two brothers, Captain William D. Esters (USAF Retired) and Arthur Lee Esters.
