She eventually became a friend of my family and we had an excellent relationship outside the world of academics. She had a place for everyone in her heart.

She had a tenacity of purpose, believing that you can achieve whatever you set out to do as long as you are focused. Little wonder that she was able to work doggedly and cooperatively too, to have the name of the Centre changed to the Centre for Educational Media Resource Studies before it eventually became a full-fledge department. It was also during her tenure as the acting Director of the Centre that a new building was approved and built by the University.

To say that she would be missed is an understatement, but as mortals we know the world is a stage where every being plays his or her own assigned role. Dr. Fadekemi Oyewusi has played her part. She played it well to the admiration of those of us who clearly understood her way of doing things, and I know that posterity will forever remember her. I remember her text “I can do a talk on effective reading...I do that for schools...my job as a researcher in UI.” This was for secondary schools in Ibadan in one of SCM programs in Nov. 2017. She was grieving the loss of her husband at the same time rising up to impact lives positively. I know she was not happy with the plight of the less privileged kids in downtown Greenville in the past yrs and she discussed about her desire to turn things around for these youth by using libraries resources to empower them to improve their lots in life. She needed to obtain some clearance before being able to carry out that passion. An associate professor from Nigeria bringing needed solutions to reduce poverty level and improve the plight of kids in the United States.



In August 2017, we reunited here in the States and has since become inseparable sisters. I was numb and dumbstruck for days. But over the night I was reading through our texts and can't but marvel with the things we have shared. We have encouraged each other in moments of life crisis and most importantly I discovered that she is my gist partner. Sis Fadekemi is an encourager. I remember when We were to gather our generation of SCM UI Alumni brethren together and I was dragging my feet. So many people had pledge their supports but she has a way of making you take action. We were on our way to dropping her to the airport on Sept 2,2017 when she snapped me from my reluctance and right there and then we formed that platform. She pledged her support which she truly supported till her last breath.

Like the mother of Zebedee's children (James & John), she wants the very best for her daughter. She made every effort to position

Jemimah so that she gets to those heights that she was not opportune to reach. I recall vividly that she had asked Medical Doctors, Yale Resident doctors, to talk to Jemimah of the steps she needs to take to be get to where they are. I pray that Jemimah fulfill purpose colorfully and in a grand style in Jesus name. I remember my gist partner with everything she stands for. Forthrightness, undaunted, resilience, and a lover of God.
